Belle Isle State Park

Belle Isle State Park is at 1632 Belle Isle Rd., Rte. 683, just off Rte. 345, in Lancaster, VA. The park has 892 acres with 7 miles of shoreline on the Rappahannock River, Deep Creek, and Mulberry Creek. Visitors can explore a wide variety of tidal wetlands interspersed with agricultural fields and upland forests.

The area, once a settlement for Virginia Indians, became tobacco land in the late 1600s. The Belle Isle manor house was built around 1760.



Over the years after the Civil War, much of the area was sold off in pieces. Belle Isle Plantation seemed destined to become a waterfront subdivision until it was purchased for a State Park by Virginia in 1993.

In 2015 the park acquired an inholding which included the manor house and outbuildings. With this purchase the historic lands of the Belle Isle Plantation were reunited. The manor is presently under restoration.

The park welcomes over 48,000 visitors annually and offers hiking, biking, picnicking, watercraft rental, and overnight accommodation in campgrounds and in the historic Bel Air area.
